We will discuss the role of computers in chess, and how computers have managed to become formidable challengers through algorithmic approaches to piece value and positional value. Students will learn how to use a chess clock, read and record algebraic notation and standard notation, and enjoy chess variants, like the fast-paced multiplayer version of chess called Bughouse. This seminar emphasizes creativity, problem-solving, and the practical application of STEM concepts. No prior experience in robotics or programming is required.
