
Seventh Grade Language Arts: Summer Assignment

Sometimes, being treated unkindly can make being kind difficult. Being unkind can leave a person feeling as bad, or worse, than the person who's been treated unkindly. Kind isn't always easy. Kindness is clearly a central theme in the book.
- 3) After reading the book, write a four paragraph thesis essay arguing that kindness is the most important theme in the book *Wonder*. Use at least three of your quotes from your quote form to support.
- 4) Your essay should be typed in 12 pt Times New Roman, double spaced, and turned in as a printed hard copy.
